## The London Underground

- 8 The London Underground is the world's largest and
- 16 oldest underground rail network. It is often called
- 25 the Tube because the tunnels are shaped like tubes.
- 34 The first line opened in 1863 and ran from
- 42 Paddington to Farringdon. Other lines such as the
- 51 Circle line, Northern line and Central line were soon
- 60 added. The first carriages were made of wood, lit
- 71 by gas and pulled along by a steam train. In 1890,
- 76 the first electrical-powered lines opened.
- 86 Today the trains are made of metal. There are 270
- 91 stations, 11 different lines and
- 96 over 250 miles of track.
- 100 Despite their name, many
- 102 London Underground
- 106 trains now travel above
- 108 the ground.
