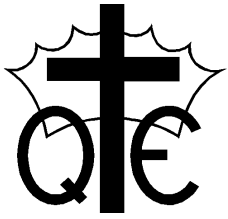

Introduction

We believe that children will achieve more when school and parents work together. This agreement sets out the role of the school, parents, and children in achieving this very important partnership.
